

## **Bob's Fishing Report**

Cold, warm, warm, cold: Ice fishing and climate change don't mix well.

#### AREA LAKES AND PONDS:

Ice conditions vary greatly in northern Illinois. Beware of skim ice, honeycomb ice, springs, and iffy shorelines.

**CHAIN O'LAKES:** Channels and some lakes with better ice. Good for bluegill and crappie on the south end of Channel Lake, jigging small ice jigs and red spikes; most shoreline ice is questionable.

CHICAGO LAKE FRONT: Perch fishing holding up well at Navy Pier, DuSable and Calumet River. Use minnows, wax worms, spikes, and plastics. Occasional steelhead, coho, king, browns being taken on spoons, spawn sacks, minnows, and cranks.

LAKE MICHIGAN: Some good cold weather lake trout fishing on reefs and breakwaters on the entire West shore from Indiana, thru Chicago, up to Milwaukee.

**FOX RIVER:** Some walleye below the McHenry Dam, using large fatheads or half a night crawler on a jig head.

**STURGEON BAY:** Ice is finally setting up. Shallow bay ice has yielded good perch and pike. Brave fishermen have occasionally ventured out in the bay for walleyes and whitefish.

**NORTHERN WISCONSIN:** Good ice and great early season ice fishing for mixed bag.

**COOLING LAKES:** Closed.

## Big Fish of the Month




#### Big Fish of the Month goes to Dave McCoy for his 11-3/4" Bluegill. You heard that right. A beast for the species!
