### Bob's Fishing Report By: Bob Diebold



Warmer days are turning on the fish on inland waters.

#### **AREA LAKES AND PONDS:**

Smaller lakes & ponds doing better as they warm first.
Crappies and gills are active on warm water shorelines. LM
Bass being caught on spinner baits, bladed jigs, and NED rigs.
CHAIN O' LAKES: Crappie in the channels with minnows and baby shad plastics in chartreuse and white. Water stabilizing.
LAKE MICHIGAN SHORE:
Cohos being caught up and

Cohos being caught up and down the shoreline on Minnows, Worms, Spawn sacs, Shrimp, Frozen Shad, Wax Worms, hair/feather jigs, spinners, etc. Some bonus steelhead, browns, and SMB.

LAKE MICHIGAN OFF SHORE:

Limits of cohos being caught by

boaters in close, inside of 30 feet, on dodgers and flies.

**DELAVAN:** Good Bluegills in the southern channels on white or chartreuse jigs.

**GENEVA:** Crappies are good shallow on bobbers and minnows over dead weeds. Some smallmouth and walleyes found a little deeper. **BRAIDWOOD:** Lots of

fishermen but limited LM Bass are being caught on hard baits mimicking shad and bluegill. Also catching blue cats on lures! FOREST PRESERVES: Some inland trout still being caught on Power Bait and spinners.

**DUPAGE RIVER:** Quality smallmouth starting to go.

**FOX RIVER:** Some SMB, perch and crappie. Water levels are receding but still muddy.

**GREEN BAY:** Walleyes still active in the river at DePere.

**SHABBONA:** LM Bass starting shallow on spinners and nightcrawlers. Crappies are good in the cribs and brush. **SHELBYVILLE:** Crappies very active on minnows, hair jigs, and plastics. Hotspots are by docks, cribs, trees, and brush.

## Last Month's Speaker Tips By: Brian O'Connor





This column provides several of the many takeaways from the last month's speaker. Dave McCoy is an avid trophy hunter who has fished for walleye and smallmouth bass in the Green Bay system for over 30 years, taking advantage of the best seasonal opportunities in the bay and feeder rivers.

In March and April Dave focuses on rivers to intercept walleye as they migrate into and out of the river during pre and post spawn. This is also relevant in river system sections that are separated by dams where walleyes move up to barriers looking for spawning habitat.

While vertical fishing a jig and minnow can be productive, Dave uses artificial baits for possibly more success by covering water more quickly. He highlighted several baits

including lipless crankbaits, blade baits, jigging spoons, hair jigs, and swim baits, all effective in various conditions.

When the bottom is relatively clean he "jigs" all these baits by making long quartering casts and retrieves with short hops. The key is to maintain the bait within 6 inches of the bottom at all times, keeping the line tight after each rip as it falls back to bottom and drifts down current. Fish often are there on the next lift or rip of the bait.

He uses heavier and longer rods to handle these heavier baits and to get higher lift angles.

Dave also employs what he calls "pulling plastics". This is very slow trolling swim jigs up river, pulling the rod forward then dropping it back so the bait briefly hovers in place.

## Fox River/DePere Wisc Outing Report









From March 22-24 six members and a guest made an impromtu trip to the Fox River in DePere Wisc to pursue pre-spawn walleye. The trip was actually postponed from a week earlier due to expected bad weather. While we got the fishing in the conditions were still brisk.

Results were mixed as some had more success than others. But in general, less fish were taken than was expected. All agreed it was a grind to get bites.


Everyone used the techniques Dave McCoy expoused during his March presentation. These included blade baits, jigging spoons, hair jigs, and jig and creature combos. All of these techniques took fish. Even McCoy's "pulling plastics" tactic had some success, although keeping bottom contact did better.

When fish did hit many hit hard. There just weren't as many hitting. Perhaps having 300 other boats all in the same area had an effect on their aggressiveness, although that's the typical congestion this time of the year. So who knows?

The big females had not yet moved into the system but there were lots of fat, healthy males. Most of the fish taken were in the 18" – 24" range making for some great pix.

The trip home on Saturday was a bit precarious as a huge snow storm moved in. Dave McCoy stayed to fish a tournament in the middle of it. He said it was the worst weather he's ever fished in. Glad we were on our way back!









## Wisconsin River/Dells Dam Outing Report



On March 26-28 ten members, including five new members, plus a junior guest traveled to the Wisconsin River near the Wisconsin Dells Dam to pursue





walleye and other river quarry. As in years past we stayed at the River's Edge Resort, right on the river. We were again lucky to get the Big House, Cabin 27, which is a stunning example of wood working art. We used this as our main headquarters, with 4 members "relegated" to an overflow cabin next door. That's a joke, of course, as that facility was also excellent.

While rarely a big fish or big numbers location, we had one of our most productive and best weather outings there in years. First Honorable Mention goes to Brian Rockwell for his 26.5" walleye. Brian was fishing the Fox River near DePere Wisc. This one came on a river jig with plastic paddle tail trailer that he was quarter casting from a fixed position, allowing the bait to tumble along the bottom on a current edge.
