Bob's Fishing Report By: Bob Diebold



AREA LAKES AND PONDS:

Bluegills hot early around isolated weed clumps. Try a jig and quiver minnow. The midafternoon bass bite has been the best with spinner baits along deeper weed edges.

CHAIN O'LAKES: Channels have bait which brings in the crappie, bluegill, bass and pike. Use tubes or floats with minnows for crappie. White bass slower but plenty are being caught. Muskies going on suckers in 8-15 feet in Channel, Catherine and Marie. Perch and bluegill are good in 2 fow on ice jigs and waxies under small floats. Cats continue on minnows, chicken liver or cutbait. Walleye good on Rippin' Raps, big blade baits or suckers in 15-20 fow.

LAKE MICHIGAN ON SHORE:

Coho and steelhead coming on minnows, jigs, or nightcrawlers under bobbers. Returning 4 year old kings being taken on skein, spoons and crankbaits. Cast glow spoons at night. Perch are starting to come into the

harbors. Large schools have been spotted out from Navy Pier. Use minnows, worms, shrimp, and artificials tipped with wax worms. **LAKE MICHIGAN OFF SHORE:** Lake trout are starting to school up on the gravel spawning reefs. **DELAVAN:** Use deep diving crank baits or jig in 35 fow for walleyes. Pike slow - try medium suckers on 12-17 ft weed edges. BGs down 20 in 35-40 fow. Perch are moving shallower. LM in 4-6' around docks. **GENEVA**: SM all over on minnows or perch on Carolina rigs. Shallower fish seem more active. Perch in 2-9 fow using minnows/floats. LM are around the piers. Use spinner baits or a white swim jig. Walleye going at night trolling bays in 30 feet. FOX RIVER: Water level is very low and crystal clear. SM feeding well on NEDs, hair jigs, paddle tails, square bills & jerk baits. Catfish active on cut bait below the dams. **GREEN BAY:** Big SM on spoons, NED Rigs, and larger minnows in 25-35 fow in and outside of bays.

DuPAGE RIVER: SM active bottom

bouncing Ned rigs on current edge.

Last Month's Speaker Tips By: Brian O'Connor



Yarmuth & O'Connor



This column provides several of the many takeaways from the last month's speaker. Cory Yarmuth of Legends Outddors spoke to the Club in October 2023 on "Fall & Winter Great Lakes Tributary Fishing", in which he shared some tips & tricks about fishing various nearby Great Lakes tributaries for steelhead and salmon. He covered reading water, choosing the proper gear and presentation, as well as how to utilize proper drifting techniques.

A few key takeaways included Kenosha Harbor being his favorite place to fish from shore due to the various water run-off spots and the number of fish stacked in these locations at the right time of year. Cory prefers to use lighter 6-8 lb mono with spoons, live bait, spawn sacks, crankbaits and X-raps to name a few lures. As for his favorite place to fish from a boat for a harbor bite, Cory said that would undoubtedly be Milwaukee Harbor due to the plethora of opportunities it presents on a regular basis. He also likes the Indiana harbors later in the year.

In terms of timing, Cory chases chinook salmon in the Fall, brown trout and steelhead in late Fall/Winter, browns and coho salmon in the Spring, and steelhead and king salmon in the Summer.

Most members like to get involved when it's convenient, which is fine. We are fortunate that others like to, or are willing, to join the process of making the member experience a positive one for all others by volunteering for an officer role. These members' time and efforts are immeasurable to our success. They cannot be thanked enough.

Arlington Anglers' 11 elected club officers are all members of the Board of Directors. The Board meets most months to discuss club policies and plan yearly activities. All provide input and get one vote when decisions need to be made.

While our by laws define positions, all engage in other roles, wherever needed. Here is a quick rundown:

President – The main responsibility is organizing the direction of the club, working with each officer to assure that all the operational elements are functioning properly. He/she presides over the board meetings and moderates the general meetings, developing the agendas for both. Among others, existing additional duties include buying raffle prizes, preparing the newsletter, and event planning.

Vice President – Presently this role is focused on sponsor and discount partner development and member relations.

Secretary – Keeping the board meeting minutes and working the check in desk at general meetings are the primary roles. Running our RM flea market sales is another.

Treasurer – This is our most critical position. Managing the budget, paying the bills, collecting and depositing revenue from various streams, dealing with insurance and taxes, maintaining our member database, and being the financial conscience of the club are all under the auspices of this position.

Speaker Chairman – Develops the annual speaker topic schedule and negotiates speaker fees. Also writes a recap article for the newsletter.

Outing Chairman - Maintains the outing schedule and assists those members that wish to organize a club endorsed outing. Procuring door prizes and helping at the general meeting check-in desk are also current roles.

Newsletter Chairman – Writes the monthly newsletter fishing report and distributes the newsletter by email. Also helps to maintain the 1100+ subscribers database.

Big Fish Chairman – Manages the year long Big Fish Contest and creates the end of the year awards.

Webmaster – Maintains and updates the club website monthly.

Sergeant at Arms – We have two positions. Their primary roles are distributing and/or selling door prize and raffle tickets at the monthly general meetings.

Community Outreach Coordinator – Although not a voting position this committee head is the face of our community volunteer initiatives.
