

Steve's Fishing Report



CHICAGO LAKEFRONT: Most harbors are holding smallmouth and northern pike. Crankbaits and plastics will take fish. When the wind blows from the west, salmon and trout will move into the harbors. Spoons and Flicker Shad's are a good bet at this time of the year.

BIG POND: Trollers in 90' to 150' are pulling spoons in green and blue in 50' to 80' for chinook, rainbows, and browns.

FOX/DES PLAINES RIVERS:

Smallmouth have been good on jig/plastics, crankbaits, and top waters. Action should only get better in later September through October.

FOX CHAIN: With cooler water temps it's time to get those Muskie rods back out. Walleye good in 6' to 10' with a jig/ minnow combo. Mixed bags of bluegills, perch, and stripers with leaf/red worms, minnows, and small plastics good under a cork. A great way to cover water is a small 1/32 to 1/64 oz jig with a small plastic casting with an ultralight rod can produce well.

LAKES DELAVAN/GENEVA:

Bluegill have been on fire in deeper water on standard rigs.

LOCAL PONDS: Bluegill and crappie going well on either live or small plastic baits under a float. Largemouth active on all area ponds on plastics, crankbaits, and top water, especially at dusk.

Bottom line: The hard water season will be here before you know it, so get off of the couch and enjoy fishing in the fall weather.

Kayak Outing Reports By Peter Laugalis






The Arlington Anglers

You don't want to miss this so get it on your calendar now! And consider bringing a significant other. More details and order forms will be sent out in October.


Big Fish of the Month
